

- B. Translate Latin to English and English to Latin. **Label each time construction.**

1. Prīmā luce multī mīlitēs sē in sua castra recepērunt sed tōtam nōs sōlī vīribus nostrīs magnīs diem pugnābāmus. Tertiō diē illius proeliī magna pars nostrum ā rēge ipsō laudāta est. *sōlus, a, um* - alone *recipio, recipere, recipi, receptus* - to take (back) *laudo* (1) to praise *vīs, vīs (f)* *castra, castrōrum* (n. pl.) camp (military)

2. Brevī tempore tibimus domum quod nostrī iam istam urbem cēpērunt. Hī multōs mensēs pugnāverant. *domum* = acc. of motion toward

3. Tertiō diē hoc proelium factum est gravius nostrīs omnibus. Eō ipsō tempore nostrae trēs aciēs nōn erant satis longae. *satis* (adv.) sufficiently *gravior, gravius* = more serious *noster, nostra, nostrum* *acies, aciei (f)* edge; **battle-line**

4) Diēs sex domī sedēbāmus in atrīo quod hostēs ferōcēs per urbis portās celeriter vēnerant. *domī* = locative case - at home

5) Multōs annōs mea uxor hās omnēs gravēs rēs memoriā suā tenēbat.
memoria, -ae (f) memory

6) Illō annō morbī longō omnēs ipsī intrā suās sē domūs multōs mensēs clausērunt.

morbis, morbi (m) sickness ipse, ipsa, ipsum (emphatic/stress/intensive adjective = himself, herself, itself, themselves, very intra + acc. = within (intramural) cludo, claudere, clausi, clausus - to shut, to enclose

7) Tribus diēbus ego solūs domum ībō sed tū cum amīcīs paucīs in istā urbe tōtam mensem manēbis. *maneō, manēre - to remain*

8) In a few days we will dine well, because soon our new cook will arrive from Greece itself.

ceno, cenare - to dine advenio, advenīre - to arrive Graecia, -ae (f) coquus, coqui (m) cook

9) At that very time our king himself seized the long horns of that ferocious animal with his strong hands. This situation/event was dangerous for all. *ipse, ipsa, ipsum rapio, rapere, rapui, raptus - to seize ferox, ferocis res, rei (f) omnis, omne periculosus, a, um*

10) For a few hours we alone without hope for victory had fought bravely in first battle-line under that bright sun. *solus, a, um spes, spei (f) hope fortis, forte clarus, a, um sol, solis (m) acies, aciei (f)*
